




Power of Dialogue

Discipleship Slow but permanent change





· Every week a new story and new activities · Every week the same procedure and methods

Procedure

- 5. Activity

 - Small group work
 - Whole class discussion

Man named the animals but needed a mate.


So, God created a woman to help him




The woman was made from man's flesh and bones.


Now man leaves his parents to be with his wife.
